THE "25"



- □ 1. Wear SCBA's on all structure, car, trash fires and throughout the duration overhaul.
- □ 2. Engineers and Command staff should wear SCBA's and full PPE in proximity to the fire.
- □ 3. Investigators and Command should wear SCBA's and full PPE while inside the structure.
- □ 4. Use wipes on scene to remove contaminants on the skin.
- □ 5. Wash hands before ingesting food or liquids while on scene.
- □ 6. Use Preliminary Exposure Reduction (Decon) on PPE while on scene.
- □ 7. Transport PPE, SCBA's, and tools outside of the cab if possible.
- □ 8. Clean contaminated SCBA's, tools, and hose back at the fire station.
- □ 9. Shower ASAP, ideally out of service and wash contaminated clothing at the Fire Station.
- □ 10. Wash PPE ASAP including your helmet, hood, gloves and boots.
- □ 11. Switch into backup set of PPE ASAP.

- □ 12. Upgrade PPE with new particulate blocking technology.
- □ 13. Keep PPE in totes if transporting in personal or department vehicles.
- □ 14. PPE should never go inside the fire station's living quarters.
- □ 15. Avoid storing PPE in the apparatus bay.
- □ 16. Only use PPE on required calls to avoid unnecessary carcinogen exposures.
- □ 17. Use Diesel Exhaust systems as recommended.
- □ 18. Avoid storing frequently used items in compartments directly over the diesel exhaust tip.
- □ 19. Keep living quarters doors shut.
- □ 20. Avoid all tobacco products (#1 risk factor for cancer).
- □ 21. Conduct annual medical and skin exams (Early detection is key).
- □ 22. Use sunscreen and wear a hat when outside.
- □ 23. Exercise and eat healthy.
- □ 24. Utilize healthy sleep habits and make sleep recovery a priority.
- □ 25. Keep documentation of exposures from fire calls.
